Resolution to Authorize Extension of Shared Service Agreement between the Township of Neptune and the Township of Shrewsbury for the Shared Use of the Municipal Clerk Services

WHEREAS, the Uniform Shared Services and Consolidation Act, N.J.S.A. 40A:65-1 et seq. authorizes municipalities to contract with each other for Shared Services; and

WHEREAS, the Township of Shrewsbury wishes to enter into a Shared Service Agreement with Neptune Township for use of services of their Deputy Clerk, Pamela Howard, to serve as a part-time Municipal Clerk for Shrewsbury Township at an hourly rate of \$30.00 per hour for 7 regular hours 8am – 4 pm (one hour for lunch) on each Tuesday of the week, while allowing Pamela Howard to serve as Municipal Clerk separate and distinct from the Municipal Service Agreement on other hours outside of regular work hours, either in the evening or on Saturdays, not to exceed 20 (inclusive of Tuesday hours) hours per week at \$30.00 per hour; and

WHEREAS, the Township of Neptune approved of the aforesaid Shared Service Agreement, review and approved by Special Counsel, Michael J. Celli, Jr., at their Township Committee Meeting of February 11, 2019.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Township Committee of the Township of Shrewsbury, County of Monmouth, State of New Jersey, that the Mayor is hereby

authorized to execute a Shared Service Agreement with Neptune Township for shared services of their Municipal Clerk (Deputy Clerk, Pamela Howard), to serve Shrewsbury Township on regular business hours each Tuesday (7 hours) at \$30.00 per hour which shall be payable to Neptune Township, and Ms. Howard may continue to serve Shrewsbury Township separate and distinct from the Shared Service Agreement during other hours not in conflict with her duties as a Deputy Clerk in Neptune Township at a rate of \$30.00 per hour not to exceed a total of 20 hours per week.

Township of Shrewsbury Resolution #2019-34

<u>Authorizing the County of Monmouth Mosquito Control Division to Conduct Aerial Mosquito</u> <u>Control Operations within the Township of Shrewsbury</u>

WHEREAS, the Monmouth County Board of Chosen Freeholders, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 26:9-27 et seq. has elected through its Mosquito Control Division to perform all acts necessary for the elimination of mosquito breeding areas and/or to exterminate mosquitoes within the county; and

WHEREAS, the County has instituted an Integrated Pest Management Program consisting of surveillance, water management, biological control and chemical control to exterminate the mosquito population within the county of Monmouth; and

WHEREAS, prior to conducting aerial dispensing operations over a designated "congested area", the County is required, pursuant to Federal Aviation Administration Regulation (FAR Part 137.51), to secure prior written approval from the governing body of the political subdivision over which the aircraft is to be operated; and

WHEREAS, the Township of Shrewsbury is designated as a "congested area" by the Federal Aviation Administration and the County has requested that this governing body consent to its proposed aerial dispensing operations.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved as follows:

- 1. The Governing Body hereby authorizes the County of Monmouth Mosquito Control Division or its agent to apply pesticides by aircraft for mosquito control in certain areas of the municipality designated by the County as being either larval mosquito habitat or areas harboring high populations of mosquitoes constituting either a nuisance, a heal hazard, or both with the understanding that:
 - a. the County shall utilize pesticides, application equipment and aircraft that are approved for aerial applications by the applicable Federal (USEPA) and State (NJDEP) agencies, and
 - b. such operations will be performed in compliance with applicable Federal and State regulations, and
 - c. the County will notify the NJ State Police Hamilton Barracks (609) 584-5000 and Mayor Edward P. Nolan (732) 977-3188 over which aerial pesticide operations are planned prior to commencement of such operations.

RESOLUTION FOR INCREASING YEAR 2019 TEMPORARY BUDGET APPROPRIATIONS

WHEREAS N.J.S.A.40A: 4-20 states that in addition to the temporary appropriations necessary for the period prior to the adoption of the budget and regular appropriations, the governing body may, by resolution adopted by a 2/3 vote of the full membership thereof, make emergency temporary appropriations for any purpose for which appropriations may lawfully be made for the period between the beginning of the fiscal year and the adoption of the budget for said year, and

WHEREAS the amount of such emergency appropriation shall be included under the correct heading in the budget as adopted, and;

WHEREAS there is a need to provide additional funds for Borough operations, and,

WHEREAS adequate provision for such funding was not made in the temporary budget.

WHEREAS the total emergency temporary resolutions adopted in the year 2019 pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 96, P.L. 1951 (N.J.S.A.40A:4-20) including the increase represented by this resolution total \$ 131,810.68 , in addition to the temporary budgets adopted January 8, 2019 in the amount of \$225,670.46 for a total Year to Date Termporary Budgety of \$ 357,481.14.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Borough of Shrewsbury (not less than 2/3 affirmatively concurring) that the items of appropriation appearing on the list be included in the temporary budget for the Borough for the year 2019, and that in accordance with the Statute such item of appropriation will be included in the 2019 budget as finally adopted.
