REPORTS -

FINANCE:

Tom Seaman, CFO stated the grace period for the taxes would be extended to August 17th. He stated the budget was great and there was a bond ordinance on he meeting tonight for Barker Avenue.

HOUSING INSPECTOR/CODE ENFORCEMENT: NONE

RECREATION:

Rich Brunson, Recreation Director stated he's gotten emails regarding recreation. He stated he would have soft ball, baseball, tennis, soccer and golf. He stated he would institute crafts on Saturdays and would have sign in sheets to see what numbers look like. He stated he would have Brookdale Coaches and players volunteer. He stated he would have a meet the Director Night and would have background checks and fingerprints done on everyone.

Katrina Thornton stated the Township held a memorial service for Mayor Nolan this past weekend and stated she was looking into hosting a dance camp.

Robin Kane, 84 Belshaw questioned who would pay for the background checks.

Ms. Thornton stated they could check with the CFO or transfer the records from Brookdale. She stated it was an idea that had to be given to the Committee.

MUNICIPAL ATTORNEY:

Mr. Anthony stated he contacted Sgt. Chaney at the State Police. The Sgt indicates there is a large group of car thieves affecting three towns and they are almost ready to arrest and charge the assailants. He also stated he's requested a quarterly report from them.

Mr. Anthony also stated as far as the sub station Sgt Chaney was involved in this discussion a number of years ago with Sue Veitengruber and it was decided that there wasn't enough room or technology. He stated they also discussed using a trailer. He also stated there was a discussion to use AVMA.

Mr. Anthony reported that Maser Consulting would be doing an evaluation on the utility system and the goal has always been to transfer to JCP&L but they did not want it unless it was up to standard. They produced a report that said it would cost \$623, 000. He stated Ms. Veitengruber did an analysis on how to pay for it which listed our bond limitations and the best we could do would be to piece meal.

Mr. Anthony stated the idea for an Administrator was when they had one for a year and a half. They hired companies to find administrators and the prices are astronomical. He gave an example as to what took place in Eatontown.

Mr. Anthony stated as far as a Strategic Plan Eatontown tried last year to have one and you have to hire a consultant which would cost anywhere from \$35,000-65,000. He stated the cost for a consultant for what they had was not worth the money.

Mr. Anthony also stated he had an OPRA request in the form of a police record. The individual was denied it. He sued to try and collect legal fees and TRC found in favor of the Township.

PUBLIC WORKS:

Mr. Anthony stated Brandon Metz resigned as a Public Works employee and the Township will advertise for the position.

CARES Act and any guidelines or regulations issued by United States government or any of its agencies and/or departments; and

WHEREAS, the Freeholders have determined that it is in the best interest of the citizens of Monmouth County to dedicate a share of the funding to reimburse municipalities for COVID-19 related costs and expenses under the Municipal Coronavirus Relief Fund Program; and

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING PROFESSIONAL CONTRACT WITH MASER CONSULTING, PA, FOR INSPECTION OF ALL ELECTRICAL FACILITIES UNDER THE JURISDICTION OF SHREWSBURY TOWNSHIP IN THE TOWNSHIP OF SHREWSBURY AND MAKING RECOMMENDATIONS FOR REPAIR AND IMPROVEMENTS

WHEREAS, the Township Committee of Shrewsbury Township has recognized recent issues concerning the Township's electrical transmission and distribution system within Shrewsbury Township, which is partly owned by Shrewsbury Township, partly owned by JCP&L and partly owned by private property owners; and

WHEREAS, the Township Committee of Shrewsbury Township has found the need to obtain a professional assessment as to areas of need for repair and improvement within the electrical transmission system, and to prioritize said repair and improvements based on the availability of funds; and

WHEREAS, Maser Consulting, PA, who also serves as the Township Engineer, has an Electrical and Transmission Distribution Division that works on small projects such as this one, which requires a review of the electrical transmission and distribution system of the municipality, and is willing to review the same at a cost not to exceed \$11,700.00.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Township Committee of Shrewsbury Township, County of Monmouth and State of New Jersey, hereby authorizes a contract with Maser Consulting, PA, for providing inspection in the field to visually inspect utility poles, identify facilities on the poles, transformer inventory, identify non-compliance items based on current regulations and gather the necessary information to compute system load demands, and to calculate loads, determine system capacity, verify deficiencies, develop recommendations and prepare a preliminary estimate of costs, as well as to prioritize repair and improvements of said system at a cost not to exceed \$11,700.00.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the contract is awarded as a professional contract not requiring competitive bidding under the Public Contract Law, but requiring public notification of its award.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Chief Financial Officer hereby certifies the availability of funds not to exceed \$11,700.00 from an Improvement Ordinance adopted by the Township Committee, and said Certification of Availability of Funds is available in the Clerk's Office for public review.

WHEREAS, as a result of the need to replace the present playground equipment, the Municipal Playground, located in the Municipal Park of the Township of Shrewsbury, the Township Committee has for some time closed off the playground area for use until the equipment is replaced; and

WHEREAS, the entire park has been closed as a result of Executive Orders issued by Governor Murphy as a result of the Coronavirus crisis, but now may or may not be opened at the discretion of the municipality as a result of more recent Executive Orders from the Governor; and

WHEREAS, the Township feels the need to open the park in general, subject to certain restrictions set forth by the Governor due to the Coronavirus, and to be reiterate the position of the Township Committee concerning the playground.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Township Committee of the Township of Shrewsbury, Monmouth County and State of New Jersey hereby continues the restriction with regard to the use of the playground located in the Municipal Park and prohibits use of all equipment in the playground and requires Public Works to post the prohibition of use and tape off or fence off the playground equipment to prevent use and to maintain said posting and taping or fencing until further notice, with the Township Committee's intent of seeking grant monies or other funding to replace the equipment and to reopen the playground sometime in the future.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Township Committee of the Township of Shrewsbury, Monmouth County and State of New Jersey hereby opens the balance of the park, less the playground area, to the public, subject to present and future Executive Orders from the Governor of the State of New Jersey, which at present requires social distancing and the wearing of a mask; even outdoors, which includes the use of the Municipal Park.

The tax bills contain the date of the grace period to be August 17, 2020. The interest reverts back to August 1, 2020 if delinquent.
